PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

High Student Achievement at ABHS

Many Year 12 students are currently completing HSC major works, projects and performances. This year's cohort has produced extremely high quality projects in the following subjects: Extension 2 English; Visual Arts; Design and Technology; Industrial Technology (Timber) and Drama. Students have been working very hard to meet deadlines for their submissions or performances. The high standard of projects this year is, I believe, the best for many years. It is also pleasing to see increasing numbers of our students taking on the challenge of these subjects. This coincides with many students in other Years taking up challenges in extra-curricular projects such as the Year 7 Personal Interest Projects and the Australian Mathematics Competition. The Year 11 Engineering Studies class recently competed in the UNSW Great Engineering Challenge, finishing 5th out of 50 competing schools, and finishing ahead of several selective and private schools. These activities, and many others, show that we are providing many opportunities to extend the creative and innovative abilities of our students and Asquith Boys students are achieving at the highest levels.

Snow Excursion

We are endeavouring to provide all students in Years 7 to 10 with an overnight camp/excursion experience each year. All Year 10 students recently had an opportunity to spend a week skiing. The excursion was very successful and the boys had a wonderful experience. Their participation and behaviour was exemplary. Here is an extract of an email I received from their hotel: *"We just wanted to write and say what an absolute pleasure it was hosting your School again this year for their snow trip. We are continually impressed by the impeccable behaviour of your students – always extremely polite and respectful to all our staff (and your staff), so much so that our staff regularly commented on "how good the kids were". We must say that we look forward to the week we host your School every season, as the staff and students are such a pleasure to look after it makes our jobs a breeze!"* The co-ordinator of the snow trip was Mr Corbitt. Next year we are planning two overseas tours. The annual international football tour is visiting Japan and Korea, while a languages group are also touring Japan.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Term 3 is passing before us very quickly, with plenty going on in both curricular and extra curricular areas of school life.

This term the school will begin constructing the 2015-2018 School Plan. A broad consultative process will be initiated, whereby all stakeholders will have the opportunity to contribute their ideas on the school's future direction. It is expected that this document will be finalised in Term 4 and published prior to the start of 2015. The new DEC Framework of Excellence will underlie this.

We are in the process of selecting students for summer grade sport teams. It is fantastic to see the high volume of students trialling for a grade team in a wide range of sports. Asquith Boys HS has a great history of participation and success in zone competitions. 2014 SPRING WALKATHON

The Walkathon will be held on **Friday 29th August 2014** when the students will walk from Asquith Boys High School to Apple Tree Bay, a distance of 10km. All boys have received their Walkathon Sponsorship card with details of participation requirements, sponsorship information and the all important prizes that are available depending on the amount of money the student raises. Please take the time to read all the information on the card and encourage your son to get sponsors for this great event. (If you have a business sponsorship please contact Mr Lappas for tax-deductible sponsorship.)

Boys need to **return their sponsorship cards by the 22nd August**. The boys will get their sponsorship cards back at the end of the Walkathon Day and then have until 19th September (last day of term 3) to return their card and sponsorship money to the cashier at school. Prizes will be given out in week 1 term 4. Only the boys who have returned their sponsorship money will be eligible for a prize.

Here are some important points regarding the Walkathon Day:

- **A minimum sponsorship amount of \$10** is required for each boy to participate in the Walkathon. For this, upon completion of the walk, he will receive lunch, which includes two sausage sandwiches, a drink and a cake.
- **A \$5 payment** is required on the day of the Walkathon for the **return bus fare from Apple Tree Bay**. This has to be paid on the morning of the Walkathon. Buses will return participants to school by 3pm.


BROADEN YOUR PALLET!

SCIENCE

Year 12

With the Trial HSC complete we are now in the home straight for our Year 12 boys. I would like to congratulate the top placegetters in each subject. I can't emphasise how important it is for students to be practising past HSC papers on a regular basis and asking their teacher for assistance when needed.

Year 11

The Preliminary HSC courses are in the final weeks with the Yearly Exams starting on Sept 9. Now is a good time to start revising topics covered at the start of the year. Boys who are struggling in Physics have the option of moving to Senior Science in Term 4. This is excellent option for those who want to continue doing some Science but are finding the Physics course not to their liking. Most boys who have moved to Senior Science in previous years have excelled and increased their ATAR mark.

Year 10

Mr Robertson's Year 10 class has been studying motion through a rocket project. The boys have been building model rockets as well as making paper rockets and water rockets. The aim is to increase understanding of Newtons Laws by looking at acceleration and the effects of mass, drag and thrust.

Year 9

All boys will participate in a Sustainability project based learning task in Term 4. The project will be open ended and the boys can choose a topic of

their choice. This will tie in with a whole school, cross curricular; project based learning focus that will continue in future years.

Year 7 and 8

All boys in Years 7 and 8 are invited to attend an engaging presentation by Ruben Meeman, the Surfing Scientist from ABC's Catalyst program. The presentation is on September 1st in the Library and will feature many exciting experiments including liquid nitrogen. This is the 4th year in a row Ruben has presented here at Asquith and the feedback is always positive.



MATHS

Year 12 have received their Trial papers back from marking. It is very important that students go through their papers thoroughly and learn from any mistakes or fill gaps in their knowledge. Each student has been provided with solutions to help with this process and teachers are available to assist with any concerns or uncertainties. Late last term we advised students to get their hands on books of past HSC papers. These are very worthwhile in helping to familiarise students with the style of questions they can expect. The next few weeks until the HSC exams are vital preparation time and we often find that students make huge leaps in their knowledge of their courses during this time.

Year 11 have exams at the end of Term 3. It is the culmination of the assessment program for General Maths, Mathematics and Extension 1. It is not quite the end of the course since there will be more content to cover early in Term 4.

Students should be aware that all preliminary content is also examinable in the HSC, so there is nothing that can be left behind as irrelevant.

Australian Mathematics Competition

On 4th August approximately 130 students from our school took part in the Australian Mathematics Competition. The boys had 75 minutes to answer a series of multiple choice questions. The questions were mainly involving problem solving and were quite different to the type of questions generally faced in most Maths lessons. We often find talent from unexpected quarters in the Maths Competition and we always look forward to getting the results back. We will update you on them in a later issue.

Year 12 students have been given the UAC Guide 2014-2015 at school. So if students have missed out they should come and collect their copy.

Uni applications opened on August 6th and students *should have now received their UAC pin in the post*. There should also be a step to step guide to applying to Uni enclosed with the pin. You also need your BOS number. The cost this year is \$29.

I held a university application session with students after the HSC trial exams. The closing date is **Tuesday 30th September**. So please apply on time to avoid huge late fees. Students can change their course preferences up till **7th January 2015**. Main round offers will be released on **Wed 21st January 2015**.

The UAC website www.uac.edu.au holds a wealth of information on ATAR, Bonus Points, Equity Scholarships, EAS scheme (Educational Assistance Scheme), etc. I have a copy of the **Bonus Points Reference** (89 pages) which I am happy to email to interested parents.

Students who have been disadvantaged educationally should also be considering to apply for the **EAS scheme (Educational Access Scheme)** for special consideration for university entrance and to organise verifying documents.

Many universities also offer **early offer university programs**. They recognize that an ATAR is not always the best measure of a student's ability to succeed in university and entry can be granted based on school recommendation. Students have been given a list of these universities and would have to provide written submission why, after reflecting on their achievements ie academic, cultural, community or sporting, they deserve a recommendation from school.

Again I would urge students and parents to visit [Mhscareers .com](http://Mhscareers.com) for lots of information on career events eg ACU Elite Athlete Program, UTS Guaranteed entry Scheme, Open Days, new courses, scholarships, apprenticeships training opportunities and much more. Login in as parent or student and password is **14cairns**. I recommend also to visit www.jobjump.com Password "**gorilla**". They have released the 2014-15 digitised course listings based on the UAC Handbook Index. This will save students days worth of course searching with the UAC handbook. Simply go to the ATAR menu item at the top of the Jobjump front page. Then select the Index field of your choice from the left hand options eg Architecture. The table listing is now visible. Now click on any of the Table Headings. They instantly sort in order of ATARs, courses alphabetical, unis, and campus.

Applications for NIDA are now available online at www.nida.edu.au/courses. Applications must be submitted **directly** to NIDA before Tuesday 30th September.
