#### Subject Information Interviews – Year 10

Subject selection interviews for Year 10 students and their parents were conducted on Monday this week. This was a highly informative and well attended day of interviews where both Year 10 students and parents were able to walk through their subject choices for their 2023 Preliminary Course, as well as receiving reassurance and support about selecting the correct pattern of study to complete and ultimately achieve their HSC in 2024.

It will now take several weeks to process all this information and construct the best subject matrixes for maximising students preferred patterns of study. While we will do everything to achieve a matrix with limited clashes and subjects not able to be offered, this is never 100% possible. Students who happen to be in this situation will receive their reserve subjects and be informed in regard to the changes to their preferred patterns of study.

#### **Mobile Phone Policy**

Thank you to the staff and most importantly the student body for their overwhelming support and response to the successfully implemented of the new 'Mobile Phone Policy'.

To date there has only been 80 students who have been reported for breaching this policy and most importantly only around 12 are repeat offenders. An excellent set of data by all accounts. This will continue to be reinforced next term, with the focus on ensuring that all our students in all year groups, continue to remain on task in the classroom.

#### Term 3 - Year 11 and 12

Term 3 is a very important term for all our students, but it is especially important for Years 11 and 12. This is the final term for the Preliminary Course of studies for Year 11, and for Year 12, their very last school term.

Year 12 they will have their Trial Examinations in Week 4 and 5, where they will be introduced to Ms Melissa Maher who will be the supervising officer for their HSC Examinations in Term 4. We have engaged her to also coordinate and administer the Trial Examinations for our students. This successful practice has been implemented at Asquith Boys High School for a couple years now. It enables the students and Melissa to become familiar with not only each other, but the actual HSC practices and procedures. This has significantly alleviated any unwarranted anxiety around consistent implementation for the actual HSC examinations for the Year 12 students in the past and we believe that it will also be the same for this year group.

#### How do I check what version I am?

From your app, go into Settings cog in the top left corner of the dashboard screen, then into App Version. (See image below.)




#### I am on Version 3 or 4
