Community Safety and Behaviour

It is, unfortunately, disappointing to communicate developments that have recently been communicated to the school. The first is that the Dry Cleaners at Asquith, situated at the crossing where an extensive number of our students cross of a morning and afternoon, have in recent weeks had students inappropriately behaving, and to the point where the owner is considering taking police action.

The second is the increasing number of students leaving the school of an afternoon to walk to the station along Jersey Street. The concern is that these students take the significant risk of running across Jersey Street to get to the station side of the street, without thought of the consequences from the oncoming traffic. Both are very disappointing to report, especially when I am placed at the Peats Ferry Rd crossing every afternoon (well, almost every afternoon) to ensure that they all transit to Asquith Station safely.

Your support in communicating with your sons in relation to both these issues would be most appreciated. As per normal, while it is not a majority of our students who conduct themselves inappropriately in relation to these two areas, it does reflect on our school within the community.

Year 10 Subject Selection Interviews – Monday 24th June

I would like to acknowledge and congratulate the efforts and enthusiasm with which all of Year 10 recently presented themselves for their subject selection interviews.

All were well prepared and had taken the requested time to review their options, subject selections, and academic pathways. They demonstrated that they had been reflective of their abilities, both in strengths and weaknesses, as well as pathway alternatives and the selection of the one that will provide them with the best options for their future career and academic pathways.

Congratulations to all of Year 10, and parents, for their participation and support of this challenging and exciting time in their school journey. I was extremely proud of their maturity and sensible approach that they displayed in relation to their subject selections for 2025.

Winter School Uniform – Terms 2 and 3

A reminder regarding the change to School Winter Uniform for terms 2 and 3 which requires the students to wear their ties and school jackets. The important points are outlined below: -

- Students must wear a tie for Terms 2 and 3.
- Seniors must wear their blazers in Terms 2 and 3.
- Students are **NOT** to wear hooded jackets (hoodies) under their uniform.
- Extra layers for warmth are **NOT** to be visible underneath your uniform.

Also, with wet weather students may wear wet/all-weather jackets over the top of their uniform to remain dry. However, once at school all wet/all-weather jackets are to be removed, as they are not part of school uniform.

As a school it is an important the picture that we present to the broader community, and uniform is a big part of that picture. Thank you to all the students and parents who always comply and do the right thing in these and the many other areas of the school.

Students who fail to wear the correct uniform will receive afterschool and NoGo detentions, and repeated infringements will result in them having the incorrect item of clothing confiscated.

Juniors : Dark grey belt loop trousers/shorts (no elastic waist cargo pants or cargo shorts are permitted). Lace up (black laces only) black leather shoes (not suede, cut below ankle) with a black sole. Green shirt with crest. Ties must be worn for Terms 2 and 3, with the top button of collar done up and the shirt must be tucked in. Grey socks with school colours, must be worn pulled up to the knee. If a belt is worn, it must be black. A green pullover with crest or polar fleece with crest may be worn.

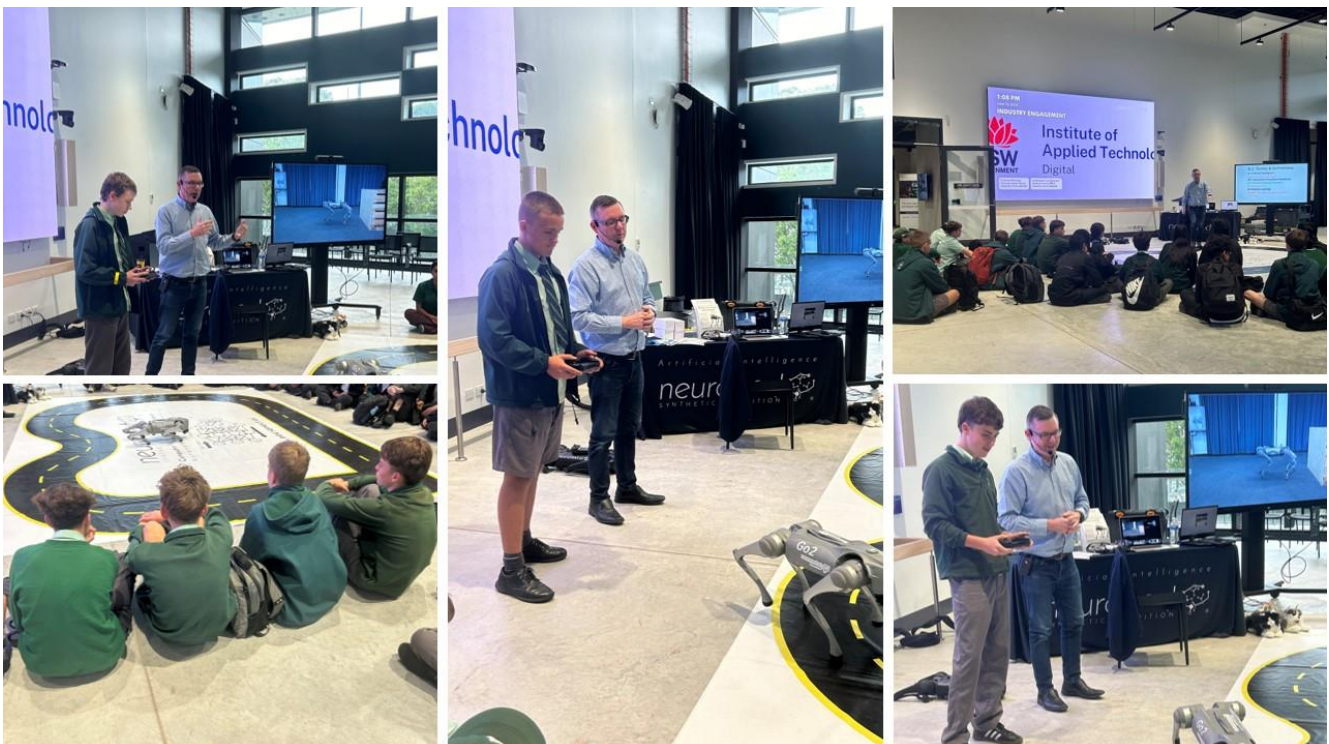

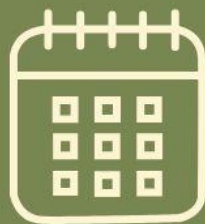
