## Principal's Report:

- Corey Miller. Under 19s Aust cricket star and former ABHS student visit
- Staff Updates
  - A new General Activities officer has been appointed
  - $\circ$  New Year Advisers appointed. With Skye being funded by DET
- Upgraded Basketball Courts.
  - Providing 2 courts and 6 rings
  - o Funded by DET
- Second Kitchen demountable finished
- Library Air Conditioning has been finished
  - $\circ \quad \text{Completing the Air Condition project} \\$
  - o Hallways were not included (they are only used in transit)
- Bin Bays have been moved from Jersey Street
  - providing a better image of the school
- Futsal courts provided new lights
  - o Making rental of the courts more attractive
  - Lights out curfew at 8:00 8:15 to relax neighbour concerns.
- New Bell system installed
  - All classroom and halls
  - Can play music too
- Oval garden beds and retaining walls completed using "School2Work" initiative
  - Oval Change Rooms/PE Change Rooms
  - o Beautification completed using "School2Work" initiative
- Citrus Ave carpark proposed to make use of forgotten area
- Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) Kits
  - Eight kits per student until end of Term
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Thanks to the many parents who picked up Kits prior to Term 1  $\;$
  - o COVID numbers down comparative to area
- Community Open Evening scheduled for 7<sup>th</sup> March 2022

#### **Grounds Report**:

- Parents have not been allowed on-site because of COVID restriction
- A tree was noticed down on top oval
  - o Bryce had already had it cut and ready for removal
  - Trees are a major concern for injury and are regularly pruned
- Cricket nets concrete has been re-laid
- Bamboo along fence line has been removed

- Some minor damage to fence was reported by a concerned neighbour
- Planter box benches completed
- Svetlana suggested an inspection of grounds by interested P&C members
  - Jackie suggested a regular Working Bee could be conducted
  - $\circ$  Bryce suggested much of the work could be done by the GA
  - Lucy commented that a greener environment was good for student's mental health

## **General Business:**

- Sentral attendances do not reflect the true attendance of a student
  - When a student is performing other duties, it is not correctly recorded
  - o Bryce commented it was not intended and could be human error
- Vaping is still occurring despite smoke/vape detectors
  - Bryce commented that the detectors are deterrents and cannot prevent those intent on transgressions
  - Jackie suggested more emphasis in educating students. Bryce stated it was already included in the health curriculum
- Students crossing side streets (Bouvardia St) often don't check for traffic
  - Bryce said that students were let out in groups so as to reduce congestion and traffic hazards.
  - o Comment, there was an element of common sense and parental guidance
  - o All agreed that generally the deportment of students was highly respectful
- The "Bio Box" (control room) in the auditorium was in an unstable condition and could be a safety hazard
  - Bryce noted that a full refit would be subject to compliance and could cost in excess of \$100,000.
  - The Bio Box matter will be reviewed with attention to the entry (ladder).
- Chris Kent expressed his gratitude for the enormous contribution to the contribution that Lucy Bal made on the production of the 60<sup>th</sup> Year book. The design, advocacy and production
  - The acknowledgement was backed by the P&C members and school community at large
