### **Principal's Report:**

- Final Emersion Day for the year

- Year 12 students are over half-way through their HSC.
  - o Exams will continue almost until end-of-year.

- Year 11 reports are due for this week.
- Citrus Avenue car park is with DoE Assets, who will submit it to Council for approval.

#### **General Business:**

- Mr. French has asked Lowes to commence production of Year 11 blazers.

  - o There is zero tolerance to bullying.
  - o The issue appears confined to one individual who is undergoing counselling.
  - Skilled counselling is hard to acquire, but ABHS is above average in services.
  - Offer made by P&C for extra-curricular support.
- Mobile Phone Policy has been implemented in line with the NSW Department of Education's Policy.
  - Policy has been verbally reinforced.

- Vaping is still being monitored and proving successful.
  - Most alerts are the results of Tradesmen.

  - Roofs have been replaced on all buildings.
  - o Three blocks need timber windows replaced, 2 will be completed over the School Holidays.
  - Two woodwork rooms in D Block have been refurbished. The remaining room and storeroom will also be completed during School Holidays.
